Reflection # 3

"It is finished"

John 19:16b-30

Jesus said "it is finished". With that, he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

What did Jesus mean?

It's a been tough few days - a tortuous few hours - I'm glad it's nearly over?

Was it a grim resignation to the fact that his death was imminent?

Was he giving up? I've had enough – it's all too much?

- 2. Take on human flesh and make his dwelling among us John 1:14
- 3. Come with grace and truth and make the Father known John 1:14-18
- 4. Become poor, so that we through his poverty might become rich 2 Cor 8:9
- 5. Become obedient to **death**, even death on a **cross** Phil 2:5-11
- 6. Be the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world John 2
- 7. Give his life as a ransom for many Mark 10:45
- 8. Be pierced for our transgressions Isaiah 53
- 9. **Crushed** for our **iniquities** Isaiah 53

- 10. Take the punishment that brought us peace Isaiah 53
- 11. Come into the world to save sinners 1 Tim 1:15
- 12. Become our **advocate** before the **Father** 1 John 1:1-2
- 13. Become sin for us that we might become righteous 2 Cor 5:21
- 14. Die for us, while we were still sinners Rom 5:6
- 15. redeem us by his blood the forgiveness of sins... Eph 1
- Be the means by which we are justified through faith and therefore have peace with God Rom 5:1
- 17. make us alive with him even when we were dead in our transgressions Eph 2
- 18. forgive all our sins cancelling the written code that stood against us Col 2
- reconcile all things to himself by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross Col
 2
- 20. to bare our sin in his body on the tree 1 Peter 2:24
- 21. to save us merely through his mercy and by nothing we have done Titus 3:3-5
- 22. to be a sacrifice for us to take away the sins of many people... Hebrews 9:28
- 23. to open a **new** way to into the holy presence of God through the curtain... so that we may approach God with confidence... Heb 10:19-20
- 24. be the means by which God reconciles us to himself !! 2 Cor 5
- 25. and make it possible for us to be made new! 2 Cor 5

.... That is what he finished!

The work of revealing the Father

The work of your salvation

The work of **cancelling** your **sin**

The work of winning your forgiveness

The work of reconciling you to the Father

The work of opening access to the very presence of the Father

---- all this was being finished – and would come to light and be revealed in the resurrection!
